

School Garden News




Aoife is a lady that works for Windyridge Garden Centre. Aoife came in on Friday to tell us about our school garden. She told us a lot how much space seeds need to grow and how seeds move from one place to another, and a lot more. First we went out to the garden, then she told us her name and where she works. Then she told us how seeds move from one place to another, these are some of the ways: They stick to animals and when they noticed they rubbed it off in a different place, the seeds pop, they fall into rivers, the wind blows them and the rain washes them away.

She also told us how much space seeds need to grow. Then she told us how to plant things and what you need to do when you are. This is what we did to plant our stuff:

First we had to line up to get our pots, then we wrote our names on a sticker to put on our pots so they wouldn't get mixed





up, then we put soil in our pot, then we had to line up to get our seeds. I chose Pansies and Emma chose mixed flowers and I think Emer chose Pandsies too and Danielle chose mixed flowers.

Mr. McGréil gave us an extra pot because he wanted us to plant sunflowers aswell. Then Aoife had to talk to my brother Niall's class, so we went inside and put our plant beside the sink, then we lined up to get sunflower seeds and then Mr. McGréil watered them.

We weren't allowed bring our plants unless we brought in a bag to put it in because Mr.McGréil said we would trip up and loose all the seeds but if they fall into the bag we can just put them back in our pot.

Gymnastics, Cycling and Games

The children also enjoyed the annual gymnastic coaching and sixth class completed the cycling skills course.

We also purchased new picnic benches and outdoor games which are being enjoyed by all.



Maths Equipment

The school invested in maths equipment for all classrooms. These resources are available in each classroom and enhance the learning experience for all our children.

The funds donated by parents each year also meet the deficit in the day to day running costs of the school, which the grants from the Department of Education do not cover. Department funding is insufficient to run the type of school we want for our children.

We are also delighted to report that the school has been granted approval of our Summer Works application to replace the old, single glazed windows at the front of the school. This work will take place during the summer holidays and we look forward to reduced heating bills next winter!!

On a related topic, we have recently introduced an e-payments facility via our Aladdin system. This will streamline all payments of funds for the school and also has been warmly received by parents. We will add the option of making a donation to the School Building and Development Fund in September.

We would like to thank Helen for all her work in ensuring the system was introduced smoothly and without a glitch.
