



Safety Issues:

In the interests of safety you are reminded not to park on the yellow markings outside the school or on the Footpaths at the main road blocking the path for pedestrians with buggies.



Everyone should

enter and leave the school by the school pedestrian gate, not by the staff car park gate. Only children accompanied by an adult may walk through the Church grounds.

Again, in the interests of safety we request that adults do not wander freely through the school. Any person coming to the school should go to the office. Teachers have requested that parents do not go directly to classrooms as this is a disturbance to their work. If a child has forgotten a lunch or any other item these may be left at the office and will be delivered to the child.

Please remind the children that they should line up in the morning and enter school with their line. Lining up time is 8.50 am. Remember: Entrance should be through the yard and not through the front door.


BT Young Scientist 2016:


Our findings will be presented in the RDS in January. We would welcome anyone from school to visit our stand on the day.
















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Junior Infant News
