Expedition to Antarctica
















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Designing Parachutes



Ms. Dunne's sixth class and Ms. Gannon's fifth class spent the month of September investing parachutes. First they investigated what was the best size parachute. Each group made parachutes of three different sizes: 20x20cm, 30x30cm and 40x40cm. They investigated which was the best size using stopwatches and metres stick to measure speed and distance travelled.



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It was important to ensure it was a fair test. The next week we explored using different materials such as tissue paper, tin foil, cling film and plastic to make the best parachute. In our third week, each group chose their best parachute and attached an egg. Their aim was to drop their parachute out the first floor window and for it to land without breaking the egg. A few groups were successful. But all had great fun designing parachutes and learned loads!
